MSW REACCREDITATION UPDATE

The last phase of the accreditation selfstudy was submitted to the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) in September and a site visit took place in November. The CSWE Board of Accreditation meets in February at which time they will decide whether to grant EU accreditation. We expect to be informed of their decision in the spring of 2024.

BSW REACCREDITATION

It may seem like a long way off but the BSW program is due for reaccreditation in 2025. Our program first earned accreditation in 1974 and has maintained accreditation status continuously for nearly 50 years. Although we have every confidence we will continue to earn reaccreditation, it is a huge undertaking and requires a great deal of work. We will keep you updated on the progress.
